Welcome to Tucker Arts Camp!

We look forward to having you join our community for a summer of creativity, culture and a lot of fun in the sun. Get ready to travel the world with Tucker Arts Camp! Please review the checklist below for the items your child will need each day at camp:

- **Snack** (Snack is provided in our After Care program, but not during camp. Please pack snack for your camper, especially if they have a severe food allergy or restriction. We are a completely nut free campus. **Please no peanut or tree nuts.**)
- **Lunch**
- **Water bottle with name clearly labeled**
- **Sun protection** (sun screen and/or hat) **with name clearly labeled**
- **Clothes that can get messy with paint, etc.**
- **For children ages 3 through Kindergarten**, a change of clothes (including socks, shoes and underwear, just in case) with name clearly labeled. We recommend labeling your child's clothes.

Each day will vary somewhat as the creative process unfolds, however, we have included a brief description of what your child can expect during the course of a day at Tucker Arts Camp below.

For children entering Preschool (minimum age 3) in Fall 2019:

The day begins at 8:30 a.m. when our younger artists gather in their Home Studio to engage in creative and imaginative play, sing, dance and move their bodies to rhythms from around the world. Children enjoy a healthy snack provided by parents/guardians and then participate in art projects. Creative time is a balance of free exploration and expression as well as structured, adult guided projects. Lunch and ample time to explore the natural world and play in our beautiful outdoor campus each day is also included in the daily schedule. The Camp portion of the day concludes at 2:30 p.m. with an Extended Care option available until 5:30 p.m. for an additional fee.

For children entering Kindergarten through 5th grade in Fall 2019:

Children gather at 8:30 a.m. each morning with the Tucker Arts Camp community to listen to live music, participate in movement activities and make new friends. Children then break into smaller community groups where they begin their daily Art Studio rotations, with a break to enjoy a healthy snack provided by parents/guardians. Next in the day is a break to eat lunch, then play in our beautiful outdoor campus. Children then rotate to a second Art Studio, then gather once more to close the day with more music and movement. The Camp portion of the day concludes at 2:30p.m. For those that need additional child care, an Extended Care option is available until 5:30 p.m. for an additional fee.
