Communicable Disease Plan 2022-23 – Tucker Maxon School

Reporting:

When there is a confirmed case of COVID-19 during the school day for a student or staff member we will immediately contact the Oregon Health Authority (OHA).

When there are three or more confirmed cases of COVID-19 at one time, Tucker Maxon School will work with the Multnomah County Health Department to determine proper sanitation procedures and possible facility closure. Phone: 503-988-3674

Daily logs are no longer required, but will continue to be a procedure that Tucker Maxon used as a way to track attendance, COVID-19 and other illnesses in cohorts. Daily Logs include:

- Student name
- Drop off/ pick up time
- Adult completing both drop off/ pick up
- Adult emergency contact information
- All staff that interact with stable group of students (including floater staff)
- Any additional registration paperwork that has the contact information of students and staff

Screening

All student and staff temperatures will be checked upon entry to the school every morning. Any student or staff with a temperature of 100.4 or above will be sent home.

In addition to temperature checks, staff and students will be screened for additional symptoms:

- New onset Cough
- Shortness of Breath / Difficulty Breathing
- Sore throat
- Runny nose
- Chills
- New loss of taste or smell

If the student or staff member displays any of these symptoms, they will be sent home.

A staff member will ask each student or adult entering the school, "Do you have any symptoms or exposures to COVID-19?" If the adult or student answers "yes" they will not be allowed at school. Additional questions and the list of symptoms will be posted at each door as a reminder to families. The posted questions are below:

- Have you, or anyone in your household been in contact with someone outside of your household who has a presumptive or confirmed case of COVID-19 in the past 14 days?
- Have you, or anyone in your household tested positive for COVID-19 within the last 10 days?
- Do you have any of the primary symptoms for COVID-19?

Any person who has been in close contact* with a person who has COVID-19 should monitor themselves and/or their child for symptoms for at least 10 days and take a home test 5 days after exposure. If the person gets a negative result, consider taking another home test one to two days later. If symptoms develop during the 10-day period, the person should isolate for 5 days and seek testing. On days 6-10 if symptoms are improving and the fever is gone, the person should wear a tight-fitting mask at all times when they are not at home. The following are exceptions to quarantine:

*Close contact for students is within 6 feet for at least 15 minutes.

If a staff member or student is found to have a fever of 100.4 degrees or higher, or display one or more of the below **primary symptoms** during the school day, they will be sent home:

- New onset Cough
- Shortness of Breath / Difficulty Breathing
- Sore throat
- Runny nose
- Chills
- New loss of taste or smell

A student (with a signed parent permission slip on file) or staff member who becomes ill with any of the primary symptoms above while at school, will be tested with a Binax Now Covid-19 Rapid Test. If a student or staff member tests positive they will be asked to seek a healthcare provider and get a standard Covid-19 test. If the student or staff member does receive a positive Covid-19 test result, Tucker Maxon will report results immediately to the OHA. Staff and students will be required to remain home for at least 5 days after illness started and until 24 hours after fever is gone, without the use of fever reducing medicine, and other COVID-19 symptoms are improving. On days 6-10 a tight-fitting mask should be worn at all times, except when eating and drinking.

A student or staff member that reports persistent **non-primary symptoms** for more than a day will be asked to seek a healthcare provider for an evaluation to determine if viral testing is needed.

Non-Primary Symptoms:

- Fatigue
- Muscle or Body Aches
- Headache
- Nasal Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

If a student displays the above symptoms during school, they will be isolated under the supervision of a staff member until pick up can be arranged with a parent or guardian.

Mitigation Strategies:

- Tucker Maxon K-5 students are highly encouraged to participate in the OHSU weekly COVID-19 diagnostic testing program. Onsite Binax Now testing is available for students or staff who develop symptoms while at school.
- All families are highly encouraged to keep their child home when they are sick.
- All Families are highly encouraged to keep their child up to date on vaccines and boosters, including the COVID-19 vaccine.
- Staff training on strategies and protocols
- Symptom screening at all drop off points
- Isolation of students or staff who develop symptoms while at school
- Physical Distancing
- Cohorting of classes
 Cohorting refers to establishing a consistent group of students that stay together for a significant portion of the school day.
 Examples include stable mealtime cohorts, classrooms, table groups, lunch bunches, and other group situations. Cohorts should be as small as feasible to minimize exposure.
- Frequent handwashing throughout the school day
- Scheduled sanitizing and disinfecting of high touch surfaces

- Air circulation and ventilation throughout the school is monitored. There is regular maintenance and replacement of Merv-13 filters in HVAC system. Each office and classroom also have a HEPA air filter system that is regularly maintained.
- Face coverings and/or possible cohort closure will be implemented when transmission is high* within our school community

*High Transmission Defined as:

- 1. At the school level: ≥ 30% absenteeism, with at least 10 students and staff absent
- 2. At the cohort level: ≥ 20% absenteeism, with at least 3 students and staff absent
